For many centuries, the Akan people of Ghana have created a unique fabric called *Kente*, which means basket. According to legend, two farmers named Krugu and Watah went hunting and came across a spider named Ananse who was making its web. Amazed by the web, the farmers went home to recreate it using fibers from a raffia tree. Then they presented it to the king. Because of this, Kente used to be worn only by royalty and wealthy people but nowadays anyone can wear kente.

There are more than 350 kente cloth patterns that have their own meaning. Some are meant to look like things and some have more spiritual meanings. Even the colors have special meanings!
