

# Lesson: Keep a Straight Face

Ages: 4th and 5th grade

Supplies needed: No supplies needed.

Project Intro: This lesson helps children explore the idea of objectives and tactics, and how they are crucial to acting.

Materials Reference: Teaching Drama, The Essential Handbook (beatbybeat Press)

Project steps:

## Warm-Up Activity:

### • Smile!

- Get enough chairs for each child and other family member participating and place them in a circle, facing inward, with one in the middle of the circle.
- Ask for one volunteer to sit in the middle and the rest to sit around the circle.
- Explain that the goal of the person in the middle is to make one of the participants in the circle smile.
- They can use any method they want without touching anyone.
- If the person in the middle gets another participant to smile, that participant trades places and the game continues.

 The objective of the person in the middle is to get someone to smile, the objective of all the players sitting is to keep a straight face.

### **Drama Activity:**

### Sausage

- Divide the participants into two groups Group A and Group B.
- Have Group A form a single file line to the right, and Group B form a single file line to the left.
- o One person from Group A and Group B will walk toward the center.
- "A" will face "B" and ask him/her a question. No matter the question, "B" must keep a straight face and answer "sausage".
- Then they will exit and a new person from Group A and Group B will walk toward the center.

#### EXAMPLE:

- A: What's that hanging from your ear? B: Sausage
- A: What's your sister's name? B: Sausage
- A: How old are you? B: Sausage
- After everyone has gone, select a few volunteers to go into the "hot seat" and ask him/her several rapid fire questions, in which each response should be "sausage" with a straight face. See if they can get through 8 questions in a row.

### Drama Vocabulary:

**Rapid Fire** – a fast exchange of questions and answers
