Title of Lesson: Comic Strips

Intro to video:

We'll make comic strips with three panels!

Comics are awesome visual stories, and are so much fun to read and write! We will look at an example of a comic strip for story structure, and think about using lines to help us explain different things visually in our drawings. I'll show you how to use some basic math to draw equally sized boxes for your comics too – this is one part you might ask for help with. No problem!

Steps:

- 1: First we'll talk about comics and elements that make them exciting.
2. Let's talk about lines, and how they express things visually. (1 min 9 sec)
3. We'll talk about comics and the structure of an exciting story. Stories have a beginning (introducing the story, scene or characters), a middle (a conflict, adventure, event), and end (the result of whatever happened in your story). (2 min 7 sec)
4. I'll show you how to draw 3 equally sized boxes on your paper. You might want to ask for help with this part... (3 min 30 sec)
5. Start to draw your comic story, with a pencil! (5 min 55 sec)
6. Once you like your comic trace it with pen or marker. (6 min 45 sec)
7. Erase the pencil lines so it looks professional. (7 min 45 sec)
8. You can color in your comic if you want to. (7 min 45 sec)
9. Write some more!! Will you write a whole comic book?
